Dear Dean Falknor:

Our Japanese students deserve our friendliness at this difficult time. There is little doubt but that they will all be taken away shortly. Even though they may be permitted to stay until the end of the quarter, many of them have the serious problem of setting their houses in order, and so will be inclined to drop out of school before the end of the quarter.

I urge that you pass on to your faculty the humanitarian suggestion that each person discuss this situation with his Japanese students, that each person be considerate of the serious problems which these students face, and that, if necessary, it be made possible for these students to round out their quarter's work without necessarily waiting for the full formalities of the last days' work and the final examinations.
